



Consultation on the Waste & Minerals Core Strategy

**Extended Consultation Period:
21 October to 15 January 2010**

East Sussex County Council and Brighton & Hove City Council are jointly preparing a Waste and Minerals Core Strategy which will help the Councils decide whether future proposals for new waste and minerals development should be given planning permission across the County and the City.

- It sets out how and where East Sussex County Council and Brighton & Hove City Council consider waste could be dealt with up to 2026.
- It explains where minerals, such as sand and gravel, which are essential to the construction industry, could be extracted and marine dredged aggregates landed.

The consultation period for the Waste & Minerals Core Strategy has been extended to Friday 15 January 2010 in light of the very high level of interest in this document. This is your chance to let us know what you think about the Council's preferred approach.
